Opportunity for the public to speak	2205	The following comments were raised by the public regarding the Traffic v Gas preference requested by Lochailort should their planning application be given approval:-	
Traffic v Gas		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cost of traffic calming and the possible funds available being able to cover these costs. • Involvement of PC in designing traffic calming. • Village Questionnaire put traffic as highest priority • Gas priority moved on since originally raised. • Highway issues-entrance to Cley Hill Gardens not seen as an issue by Highways. • Funding proposed by Lochailort-could it be used elsewhere for the village initiatives? • Traffic calming -could it involve improvement of pavements throughout village and prevent cars travelling over pavements? • Traffic calming-may slow traffic and encourage some traffic to take different route and effectively improve safety.

Thoulstone	2208	Thoulstone Park Application. On line -132 documents to be viewed. Chair explained application. Natural Retreats will have 25 year lease as Holiday Let Business. Section 106 within another Parish. Rights of Way remain in place but diverted to the perimeters.
	2209	Comments from the public were largely positive: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Derelict buildings attract wrong people • People living on site a bonus • Previous Golf course a problem for a long time. • Presumably events would finish • Better plan than previous hotel etc. particularly for opportunities for employment and local economy. • Strong will to link with the local facilities e.g. pub. • Access unchanged from present process. • 4 houses for staff accommodation. • Wiltshire Highways have no problems with Road safety. • Footpath/bridleway upgrades discussed.

<p>Page 3</p> <p>Traffic v Gas</p>	<p>2218</p>	<p><u>Planning Applications 18/00311/FUL Lochailort- Former Commercial site Barters farm - Letter and Gas v Traffic.</u></p> <p>Following further discussion the council decision was as follows and clearly based on the application being successful:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The council would make clear that their comments for the first and amended application remain in place and this response is not withstanding the new application yet to be processed by Wiltshire Planning Authority. • With regard to the preferences given it is very clear that over the last two years the enthusiasm for Gas within the village has dissipated. The traffic issue however has increased in intensity. This was the major concern for the Village Voice and at the top of the priorities identified for the Village and was also supported by the majority of residents who attended the meeting. • Therefore traffic calming/improvements that would; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a). ensure a safer passage for both pedestrians and vehicular travel throughout the village and b). reduce traffic wanting to drive through the village would be greatly appreciated. • The council also made it very clear that they would want to be involved in and agree any designs and costings in relation to traffic calming.
